Philanthropy Brings Happiness

Generosity and philanthropy create happiness according to Harvard professor, Michael Norton. In his TedX Talk, "How to Buy Happiness", Dr. Norton expands on the research which supports the notion that spending money on others makes people happier than spending it on themselves. But there are a variety of best practices to do so in philanthropy.

These days, a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) has become one of the simplest and most efficient ways for affluent individuals to participate in those positive feelings that come from philanthropy. DAFs have advantages over Private Foundations (PF).

A DAF is easy and low cost to create and then "plugs into" the sponsoring organization, generally a public charity qualified under IRC Sec. 501(c)(3). Under the rules of the DAF, the board of directors must include members of the supporting organization to provide oversight. However, the founder of the DAF may control the decisions regarding operations and donations.

With the PF, the founder has full control over the operations and donations but is subject to more heavily regulated guidelines. A PF must file an IRS Form 990-PF every year and comply with state annual organizational filing requirements, which includes a list of assets, contributors, and grantees. With a DAF, there are no state or federal annual filing requirements, and donors can retain their anonymity.

The rules require the PF to make an annual distribution of at least 5% of the previous year's net assets. There is no minimum distribution required of DAFs.

Just about any type of asset class may be contributed to the PF and the DAF, such as cash and cash equivalents, publicly traded securities, and mutual funds. Non-liquid assets like art, antiques, and real property are generally not allowed to be received by the DAF. While any type of asset can be liquidated before deposit into a DAF, this may incur fees and taxable gains.

Both PF and DAF contributions escape estate and gift tax as both are exempt as charitable donations. There are income tax differences though. The income tax deduction limit for securities held for more than 12 months to a PF is 20%, and to a DAF, it's 30%, with the same respective limits on other kinds of donated property. The total annual contribution limit to a PF is 30% of a donor's adjusted gross income (AGI), while it is 60% for a DAF. If the charitable deductions exceed these annual limits, the deductions may be carried over for 5 years.

Affluent families and successful business owners are

increasingly becoming "happier" by getting more involved with philanthropy. The DAF is the more favored medium due to the requirement that donations do not have to be made annually, there is flexibility and low cost in formation and operations, and the donor can remain private.

What inspires you to give?

• Hoag Hospital

I had the opportunity to speak to a group of about 500 people at a Hoag event. I asked the audience; how many people in this room have had a son, daughter, or grandchild born at Hoag? An ocean of hands went up. Think about it, do you know family or friends born there... There was one lady who had 23 relatives' born at Hoag! That was our first ah ha moment. As Lori and I have gotten more involved, we have developed a heightened awareness to the institution and the people who work there every day. We have been "moved" by the quality and scope of talent that is in our own backyard. It is clear, Hoag has built a culture of excellence that is on display every day.

• Be Well.

Issues with Mental health have been under the rug for a long time with few solutions when someone is faced with "where do I go, or take my loved one, for help?". Be Well is addressing this serious question and leaders in our community are actively helping put this issue in the light. Lori and I are committed to support this organization and their strong leadership. We believe it will provide all of us an avenue to help loved ones, and an additional benefit will be to provide a big step in addressing the homeless issue in Orange County.

What inspires you to give?

My inspiration comes first from the organization itself. I love to do "research" about them and find out the technical aspects: who is on their Board, how much of the funds raised go towards programming, etc. Next comes looking into the program itself. What would I be funding? How are the funds to be used, and where? It sounds very institutional but I find it very rewarding to "give" this way, and I usually stay with an organization longer because of this method. But there are certainly times when I just feel a need to support a request. Usually, it is because a family member asks me!!!

Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that has had the greatest impact on you.

I think the greatest impact I received was from working with Special Olympics...when I was 13 years old!!! My Junior High teacher was a volunteer with Special Olympics and offered our class "extra credit" to anyone who would volunteer for the weekend to help with the event. Knowing how much I needed the extra credit, I said yes immediately. Never would I have thought that the experience would have changed my life! We were each assigned an Olympian for the two- day event to help them make all of their competitions, etc. I became so close with my gal that by the last race Sunday afternoon, I found myself running with her because she was struggling to finish!!! I could barely run myself, but together we did it!!! The hug she gave me at the end was beyond words. And I have been a "volunteer" with philanthropic organizations ever since!!!

What inspires you to give?

It was important to our family that the Crystal Cathedral remain true to its dedication as a house of worship. It was an incredible journey, extraordinarily impactful, and a providential opportunity of which I will remain forever grateful.

Outpatient & specialty care

Set to open in late 2023, the second phase of the Irvine complex is the construction of the Chao Family Comprehensive Cancer Center and Ambulatory Care, named for the Chao family in honor of their gifts to UCI Health totaling \$50 million. The complex will also house a 144-bed hospital, which is scheduled to open in 2025. The hospital will focus on key clinical programs such as oncology, neurology, neurosurgery, orthopedics and digestive health, and it will include a 24-hour emergency department.

It will have an all-electric central utility plant that will also recycle water for irrigation. A healing garden and serene outdoor waiting rooms will have low-water-demand plants. Renewable power sources will also provide electric heating and cooling systems. In addition, the complex will overlook a lush naturescape and marsh.

Designed to be at the forefront of healthcare, UCI Medical Center – Irvine will serve as a hub for research, teaching and healing. It also will enable UCI Health to continue to attract renowned medical professionals who will push the boundaries of care. Most importantly, patients, especially those with exceedingly rare conditions and diseases, can soon expect

to receive greater access to top-notch care from specialists who provide the most advanced treatments.

- The new hospital will provide inpatient oncology care, along with neuroscience, spine, orthopedic and surgery services.

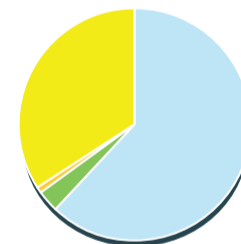

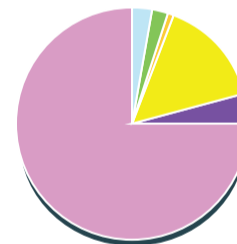

What was your greatest community impact in 2021?
 The term “health equity” has been around for quite some time. It means, simply, what our world would look like if all people had the same opportunity to be healthy. The tragic reality is that social, historical and systemic factors have led to a lack of health equity in under resourced communities and among many Black, Hispanic, Indigenous and Asian people. Gaps are evident everywhere people live: urban, suburban and rural environments.

While the American Heart Association has long pushed for health equity, the turmoil and trauma that brought historical inequities to the forefront in 2020 prompted us to ramp up our already aggressive approach. 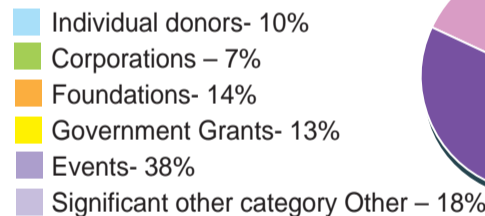
CASA OC served 1,634 children under the jurisdiction of the OC Juvenile Court; 1,047 through a one-on-one relationship with a volunteer mentor-advocate; while 587 children received advocacy services through our Waitlist Coordinator and/or Family Connection Program.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers undergo 34 hours of comprehensive training up front, complete background checks and are interviewed by staff before they are sworn in as advocates. The CASA volunteer will be matched with one child in the Orange County dependency system with whom they will visit with on a regular basis (at least twice a month for two hours), interact with professionals involved in the case and make recommendations directly to the court at Periodic Review Hearings, ensuring that the child’s best interests are protected while they are in dependency.

After a very challenging financial year with the cancellation of the 2020 art show and Pageant of the Masters due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Festival of Arts opened its doors in 2021. It gave nearly 190,000 people of all ages access to the fine arts, created career and income opportunities for 120 local artists, and recognized the artistic achievements of nearly 250 Orange County students with varying economic backgrounds and diversity.

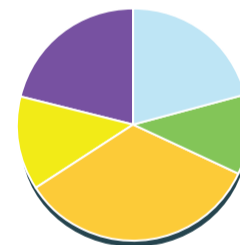

Our **Rescued and Restored Housing Program** will offer emergency, bridge, interim and healing housing with trauma-informed supportive services to at least 307 individuals experiencing homelessness, including survivors of domestic violence, human trafficking and other crimes, older adults and people with disabilities.

Our **Nana's Kidz** program will reduce food scarcity and hunger for low-income families through hands-on distribution of nearly 375,000 meals directly to 2,100 hungry kids and feeding an additional 2,000 through holiday events.

Our **HopeWorks Education and Enrichment Center** will provide food, one-on-one mentoring, care coordination, after school programming and other support services through our HWEEC program, which is based in a very low-income Section 8 housing complex—Cherry Orchard—in west Anaheim that houses 44 families, including 100 adults and 65 children.

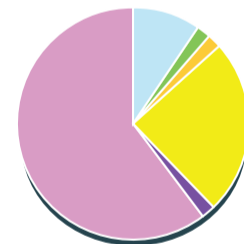

With a spend policy of 5%, our current \$2 million endowment will generate \$100,000 per year. 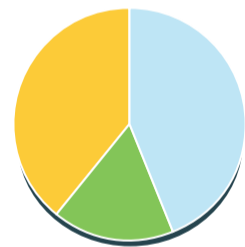

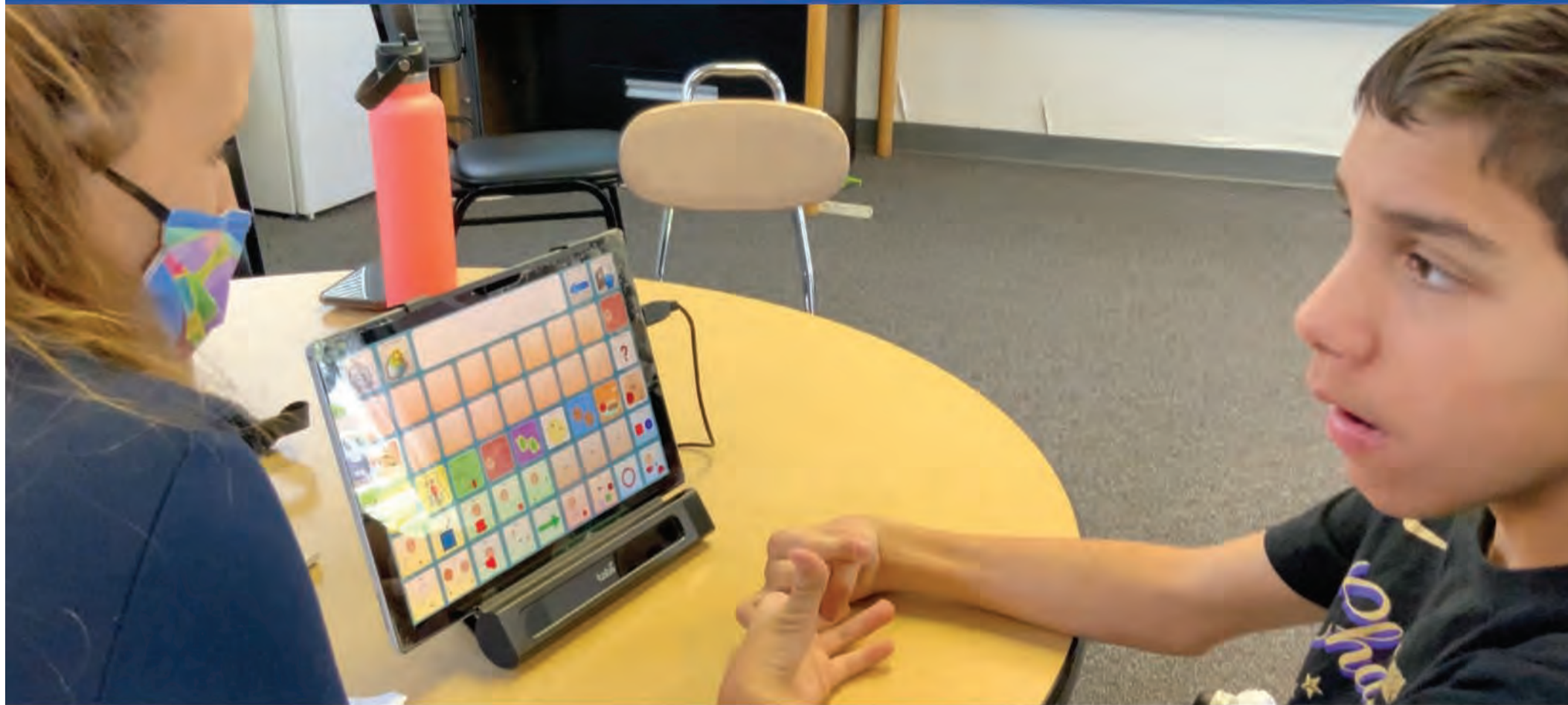

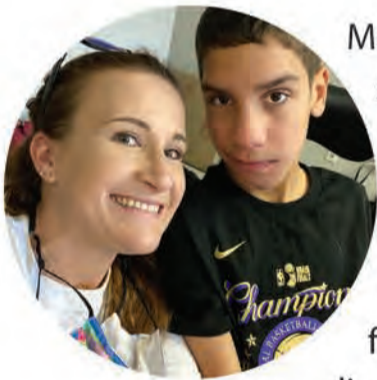

Meet Zack. Zack is a typical teenage boy, he loves sports, sharing good jokes, and is a friend to all. This extraordinary young man has limited access to the world he lives in. He is physically unable to verbally communicate, though he understands everything. His physical limitations, prevent him from participating in social exchanges or classroom discussions.

Recently, he had a trial using an eye gaze speech-generating device with environmental controls. This device opened his world. Using this loaned device, he communicates independently, using controls to turn up the volume on the TV, asks Alexa to play music, and to text message his friends' memes and GIFs. Now there is a new barrier to Zack accessing his world. He needs access to a voice he can call his own. The cost of this technology being the greatest barrier to receiving a speech-generating device. Zack has gone years without an adequate system, and he is not alone. Your support puts specialized devices like this in the hands of kids like Zack. Your gift gives them a voice.
