What inspires you to give?

Our faith really inspires us to give, as well as giving just feels good! The lessons learned from Gary's mother, a southside Chicago Polish woman, who would give her shirt off her back and would bring in refugees from different parts of the world to live with the family, had quite an impact on him. Our giving began shortly after we started the company and we believe it has contributed greatly to its success. We started by donating free printing to causes we believed in and later we started donating cash to support Catholic education and other causes which were important to us. More recently, we have expanded our giving to public education and scholarships through the Rosser Schools of Education at USC, whose mission is to improve college outcomes for low income, first generation, and underrepresented students which Gary is involved as a member of The Board of Counselors. In 2006, with the support of donors and friends we held our first Super Bowl Event honoring our Marines and Veterans at our home in Coto De Casa which is where it took place for the first five years. After our move to Corona Del Mar in 2013, we moved the party to the American Legion Post 291 in Newport Beach who has been a terrific partner for us in hosting this event. We just completed our 13th year and had over 500 Marines and Veterans in attendance! Proceeds from this event go to the Dana Point Regiment Support Group. As Winston Churchill once said, "we make a living by what we get. We make a life by what we give."

Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that had the greatest impact on you.

Julie and I have been blessed to have worked closely with Terry Rifkin the President/CEO of the Dana Point 5th Marine Regiment Support Group and her team whose mission is to provide support and outreach for the benefit of our wounded, families of our fallen, and active-duty Marines. They have been our partners in hosting our Super Bowl Event for the Marines and Veterans for the past 10 years, and are a real "boots on the ground" organization with zero salaries and every penny donated goes entirely to those hero's they serve. It has been quite an honor for our event to donate to this nonprofit as they support Marines and their families in so many ways. The 5th Marine Regiment is assigned as the lead Regiment for Crises Response should US ground forces be required, their bravery is just remarkable! For these men and women, duty, honor and country are more than just words and Julie and I have been humbled and couldn't be more proud to support their efforts!

What inspires you to give?

Our family has a great deal of respect for Hoag. Each and every facility and person that work there are very passionate about what they do. Our community is better for that. My children were born at Hoag. I was a member of the 552 Club, became a Benefactor, and I became very familiar with Hoag, and it became very strong in my life. My daughter Devon is on the Hoag Hospital Foundation Board of Directors and enjoys it. We're so fortunate in Orange County to access the talent pool at Hoag and be involved. I have found over the years that if you have passionate, educated people dedicated to long-term success like those at Hoag, they make things happen. Our family saw the Hoag neurosciences institute and the breakthroughs being made, and knew we were making the right decision to give to it.

What inspires you to give?

For as long as I can remember, I have always wanted to help those in need. These were simple acts, like lending our clothes or preparing a warm plate of food. At the time, I didn't consider this 'giving' because it was just a way of life. It was only after many, many years of hard work that I was in a position to give back in a bigger way. I came from very humble beginnings. I grew up in a small village in Gujarat, India and worked as a farmer to put myself through college. I relocated my family to the United States via Zambia, in search of economic opportunity. By the mid-1990's, my entrepreneurial journey began to find success in the hospitality industry; and by 1999, my wife and I began our philanthropic endeavors. We were always committed to giving back to the community we came from. We started out by supporting a range of education and community development programs in our hometown of Gujarat. Over the years, our work expanded to the U.S., and today Tarsadia Foundation supports impact programs all across the globe. We are very fortunate that our humble beginnings have gotten us to where we are today. And now we have a big responsibility to remember our roots and to lift up others by providing the opportunities they need to reach their fullest potential.

Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that had the greatest impact on you.

The work we do in India occupies a big part of my heart. Even though three generations of Tarsadia family members reside in the U.S. today, India will always be home. The nonprofit organizations we support there have become trusted partners. It has been inspiring to see their dedication and commitment to the communities they serve, and the hundreds of thousands of lives they've impacted along the way. I have always felt particularly connected to an organization called Diwaliben Trust, which works predominantly in the tribal region of South Gujarat. Diwaliben Trust promotes education, health, women's empowerment and community development in and around the village I grew up in, serving over 1 million underserved individuals each year. The organization was named to honor my late mother, Diwaliben Patel, and the work they do reflects the values she instilled in me at a young age; values of service, partnership and compassion. Working with Diwaliben Trust over the years has become deeply personal for me, and I am proud of the legacy they are making.

What inspires you to give?

My parents instilled in our family the importance of serving the unwanted, vulnerable, and often forgotten. My father, Richard Lehn, was an orphan who endured many trials in life including experiencing homelessness. He never gave up. We wanted to honor my father with a legacy gift. Illumination Foundation is creating an intergenerational campus that will bring together families and seniors who are experiencing homelessness. It is named the Richard Lehn Intergenerational Campus in memory of my father. We are delighted to support turning a former convent into permanent supportive housing for the vulnerable in the community. This project aligns our beliefs and interests together in one campus. Illumination Foundation's caring and passionate staff will provide wraparound services to meet the complex needs of clients on this campus while fostering a supportive community of families and seniors. This is the type of innovative solution we need to disrupt the intergenerational cycle of homelessness. I know my father would hope and pray that everyone who enters this home has the same resilience and motivation, to never give up on life.

Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that had the greatest impact on you.

I have devoted my career and philanthropic efforts to helping the most vulnerable individuals in our community. I'm on the board of Illumination Foundation and have co-chaired their annual Chef's Table gala for several years. There are many faces of homelessness. When you take the time to speak with families, children, and seniors experiencing homelessness you realize that homelessness can happen to anyone. Everyone has their own story. I have interacted with many families who received services from Illumination Foundation and it has made a life-saving impact. One success story I have experienced with Illumination Foundation, and it is the most rewarding experience I have encountered, was getting to know Megan and Demetrius Smith and their precious son Lyon. They are true heroes to me! Their example of grit and humbleness is an example to me in my daily life. God always has a plan, and if we trust Him and push forward with patience and perseverance, and with some precious help from people like Illumination Foundation's team, there is hope. The Smith family is independent now, living on their own in their new apartment and I am lucky to know them and call them my friends. We owe it to each other to take care of the most vulnerable and give them hope, safety, and security.

VOLUNTEER & GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers complete 34 hours of comprehensive training, clear a background check, and are interviewed by staff before they are sworn in as advocates. The CASA volunteer is then matched with one child or a sibling set of two children in the Orange County dependency system with whom they visit on a regular basis (at least twice a month for two hours), interact with professionals involved in the case and make recommendations directly to the court through written reports.
