



Upon reflection, however, I was reminded of my mentor Gregor Sutcliffe, a UCI alumnus who made groundbreaking contributions fundamental to advancing molecular biology. Similarly, at my company, Ambry Genetics, we also made several innovations that have been fundamental in applying molecular biology to clinical practice. Both of us began our careers as passionate, hardworking, creative scientists who secured entry-level positions in academic laboratories, benefiting from the resources provided by the university system. Through this donation, I aim to pay it forward, supporting the next generation of scientists and innovators. The students at UCI are among the most dedicated and hardworking young people in the world. I have complete faith in their potential and the positive impact they will have on advancing Orange County's scientific community and produce strong economic results for the county.

### Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that has had the greatest impact on you.

I love interacting with everyone at UCI from support staff to students to professors, I even strike up conversations with the parking attendants.

### What inspires you to give?

Because of the amount of work we put into our own life, we now have time to help others. If you have the opportunity & ability to help, you should. It's the right thing to do. Some people don't have the time, but there are those of us who can make a difference - that is the right thing to do. There is also something so beautiful about seeing our families grow together in the spirit of giving back. We now see our children supporting philanthropy, and even our grandchildren giving back. Our whole families have grown up with Stars & Stripes Children's Foundation. This whole concept of generational philanthropy is such a beautiful thing to be a part of.

### Summarize a personal experience you've had working with a nonprofit organization that has had the greatest impact on you.

Dicko's life came full circle when he was stung by a swarm of Portuguese man-o-wars spearfishing. Racing to the hospital, he was dying of cardiac arrest, the driver, in a rain storm, mistakenly took a wrong turn and they found themselves in the barrio of Cabo San Lucas. At that time, 11 miles in the wrong direction away from the hospital, his friends started doing CPR in a panic. Then out of nowhere, they came across a brand new ambulance in the barrio. The paramedics knew exactly what to do where they saved him with a shot of adrenaline to his heart, along with giving him IV's - the ambulance had everything needed to save his life. It turned out, that ambulance was funded by Stars & Stripes, given to the community only 1 week prior, and in full circle, saved Dicko's. The best karma story ever.

### What inspires you to give?

Though there wasn't formal early education, the nurturing environment built his curiosity, resilience, and adaptability—qualities that became the foundation of his success.

That's why Rocket Learning's mission resonates so deeply with us. Research shows that the first six years of a child's life are critical for brain development. During this time, billions of neural connections are formed. These early experiences shape cognitive, emotional, and social growth. If a child doesn't receive stimulation, care, and education during this window, it becomes much harder to catch up later in life.

Rocket Learning focuses on ensuring children in underserved communities receive that vital early education. When we see children learning, parents engaging, and communities transforming, it reinforces our belief in the power of these formative years. It's about breaking cycles and creating futures. If we can help even one child have a stronger start in life, then we know we've made a meaningful difference.



The Ronald M. Simon Family Foundation's impactful support of Chapman University's Physician Assistant (PA) Program serves as a powerful example of how philanthropy can shape the future of healthcare and improve lives. It also ensures that Orange County has what it needs, too.

The Simon Family Foundation started the Simon Scholar PA program at Chapman in 2019 with a generous donation. The first cohort of Simon Scholars was admitted to the highly selective PA program in 2021. The latest gift supports the program with funding for 10 full-tuition scholarships for each entering class for at least five years. As part of the program, the students commit to working in Orange County for three years after graduation.

While the entire country is facing a shift in demographics, Orange County—the sixth most populous county in the United States—serves as a perfect representative sample. Nearly one in four residents in Orange County will be 60 or older by 2040, compared to 14.3% in 2019, according to the Orange County Health Care Agency. This presents several challenges, mainly because there aren't enough healthcare providers in the county to care for these older adults, and many are not well-versed in caring for a senior population.

### Philanthropy Starts Here

At Chapman, we believe that supporting the needs of our community and creating lasting change starts at home. Whether through scholarships, or investments in state-of-the-art facilities or cutting-edge research initiatives, every contribution has the potential to transform lives and entire communities. As an Orange County anchor institution with physical presences in Orange and Irvine, we look forward to enriching and expanding our local partnerships and thank our many committed supporters who help to make Chapman so special. ■

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers complete 34 hours of comprehensive training, clear a background check, and are interviewed by staff before they are sworn in as advocates. The CASA volunteer is then matched with one child or a sibling set of two children in the Orange County dependency system with whom they visit on a regular basis (at least twice a month for two hours), interact with professionals involved in the case and make recommendations directly to the court through written reports. This is all to ensure that the child's best interests are protected while they are under the jurisdiction of the dependency court. Learn more about becoming a CASA volunteer at www.casaoc.org. Our Outreach team is also working with local organizations to identify those at risk of homelessness and provide the temporary services necessary to ensure they stay housed.





## GOALS FOR 2025

Hope Builders believes that access to opportunity makes a difference and is laser-focused on moving young people from poverty to prosperity. Hope Builders aims to solve for two challenges:

- 1) young adults, who live in low-income neighborhoods, often lack access to upwardly-mobile employment; and,
- 2) Orange County employers lack a skilled, reliable pipeline for middle-skill jobs. There are close to 30,000 Orange County young adults who are disconnected from the workforce and education. Hope Builders strives to increase the number of young adults it connects to careers and to increase its sustainability through income generated by its social enterprise staffing agency, Hope Builders Career Connections.





## Lestonnac Free Clinic

### GOALS FOR 2025

#### Surgery Center Update

Over the past 41 years, Lestonnac has grown from a single-room clinic to multiple locations across Southern California. As we continue to expand, we are excited to take a major step forward in breaking down barriers to healthcare with the upcoming launch of the nation's first dedicated free surgery center, offering non-life-threatening surgical care at no cost to patients.

The new 4,000 sq. ft. surgical center, set to open soon, will feature two fully equipped operating rooms. This space will allow our team of volunteer surgeons to perform essential procedures such as colonoscopies, hernia repairs, eye surgeries, and other critical yet often overlooked treatments.

We are now recruiting volunteer Surgeons, Anesthesiologists, and Registered Nurses to join us in this exciting mission to make a lasting, positive impact on our community.

#### Unhoused

Lestonnac Free Clinic's street medicine team is expanding its services to provide free nighttime medical care to unhoused individuals across Southern California. This vital program offers a range of essential services, including wound care, hygiene assistance, and in-field testing and treatment for conditions such as HIV, Hepatitis C, syphilis, hypertension, cardiac issues, COVID-19, flu, and more.

Our efforts aim to alleviate the burden on emergency medical services in Orange County, ensuring that unhoused individuals receive timely care before their conditions worsen. By providing trauma-informed care and early intervention, we take critical steps toward breaking the cycle of addiction and helping individuals move off the streets for good.

We are currently accepting donations and actively recruiting volunteer Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to join our team in this important work.





By placing full-time case managers directly on school campuses, we can remove barriers caused by homelessness in the lives of our kids so they can fully access their education. We continue to support our kids after high school graduation to support them as they navigate college, vocational school, and young adulthood.

In addition to daily 1:1 support, we provide enrichment activities and workshops throughout the year so our kids can develop life skills, gain exposure to new career opportunities, and create fun childhood memories like going to the beach, enjoying a baseball game, and spending the day at local museums.
