# Chapman's Strength and Consistency of Leadership Have Led to Great Success

Chapman University has a long tradition of presidents with staying power—and visions to continuously and seamlessly build on the progress made by their predecessor. President Emeritus Jim Doti, who served from 1991 to 2016, is known for evolving Chapman from a regional college to a comprehensive university that increased its academic quality and selectivity and strategic prowess. He also found a strategic partner in a promising then-provost, Daniele C. Struppa. Struppa built on Doti's legacy in nine years as president and 19 overall with the university to date. Struppa established Chapman as an R2 university, meaning it produces some of the highest research activity in the country, and he catalyzed the university's multifaceted growth. He recruited top faculty from around the world, opened new schools, colleges, and buildings, and he helped strengthen Chapman's financial and market position and reputation.

When Matt Parlow, Chapman's newest president who began his term on Sept. 2, came to Chapman as dean of the Dale E. Fowler School of Law in 2016, he stood out to Struppa for his intelligence, commitment to mission and values, and results. Parlow, who previously taught and served in the law school from 2005 to 2008, recruited and graduated some of the highest-performing students in the history of the law school as dean. Struppa and Parlow's chemistry and bond ignited what would become a highly successful partnership and an opportunity for Parlow to learn from the best. In the years leading up to his presidency, Parlow excelled as an executive vice president and chief advancement officer at Chapman, where he deepened the university's connections to its communities and propelled its philanthropic efforts to support students, raising more than \$400 million toward its \$500 million *Inspire* comprehensive campaign goal.

As Chapman University's president, Parlow brings decades of expertise in higher education administration to help continue Chapman's momentum and tradition of excellence. For Parlow, education is so much more than his career. It's the foundation of his family's story and the force that has shaped his life. His care for students—and the power of education to fuel their trajectories—is deeply personal.

# Matt Parlow's Lifelong Passion for Education and Strong Leadership Brings Chapman University Into Its Next Phase of Growth

An Orange County resident for the past decade, Matt Parlow grew up in a household of modest means in the Hollywood. His parents, Richard and Anita, were first-generation college students who grew up in an orphanage and in the foster care system, respectively. Seeking stability and opportunity, they each moved from New York state to Southern California, where they worked to pay their way through community college classes.

Eventually, they accepted teaching jobs at an elementary school within the Los Angeles Unified School District. It was a humble childhood, as Parlow recalls his father running an antiquing business on the weekends so they could put Parlow and his brother in the best schools and provide access to all the opportunities his parents didn't have.

They never faltered in their passion for education and their belief in its power to change lives throughout their 40 years as teachers, especially as they saw students facing many of the same challenges they endured as children.

"My parents instilled in me a reverence, a love, of education," said Parlow. "They taught me the importance of education for social mobility."

That passion, nurtured by his parents' experience, ignited Parlow's ambitious career path. Through every achievement, his guiding philosophy remained focused on advocating for and connecting with people.

He went from student government involvement as an undergraduate at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles to volunteering legal aid at soup kitchens as a law student at Yale Law School. Soaking up every opportunity he could, Parlow practiced law at the prominent firm Manatt, Phelps, and Phillips and clerked for Judge Pamela Ann Rymer of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. He also found a passion for policy in his positions in the White House's Office of the Legal Counsel and the Office of Los Angeles Mayor Richard J. Riordan.

But one of the more formative experiences was at Yale in his first teaching experience. It was then that he deepened his appreciation for the work done within the classroom.

"I loved being a professor because I could help make an impact in the lives of students who were looking to launch their futures and their careers," Parlow said.

Now, Parlow is bringing more than 25 years of higher education leadership experience, a love for expanding access to personalized education, and unwavering energy to his new role as Chapman University's president.

"We've had an incredible trajectory the last 30 years as an institution," Parlow said. "We've transformed this university in ways that are the envy of all of higher education. And yet, with where we stand today, there's still incredible potential and opportunity ahead of us."

What sets Parlow up for success to pursue that potential isn't just the strong foundation Struppa and Doti laid. It's a tenure of more than 12 years of impact at Chapman. He first joined the faculty teaching property, land use, and sports law at the Dale E. Fowler School of Law in 2005. For three years, he built strong connections with students, faculty, and administrators to support the bar preparation program and the new entertainment law certificate program.

In 2008, he paused his Chapman experience to join Marquette University Law School in Milwaukee, Wis. Within one year, he was awarded tenure, and, within two, he advanced to associate dean for academic affairs. There he grew curricular offerings, law student community engagement, fundraising, and donor relations, and had the opportunity to co-teach with Major League Baseball Commissioner Emeritus Bud Selig.

Parlow returned to Chapman in 2016 to serve as the dean and Donald P. Kennedy Chair in Law at Fowler Law with momentum. Doti, who had taken note of Parlow when he first joined Chapman, recalled how Parlow’s quick command of the law school, and later his role as the executive vice president and chief advancement officer, was what exemplified Parlow’s exceptional leadership qualities.

“I knew he was a great academic, great researcher,” Doti said. “But he came back with the confidence he had gained as the associate dean. And he hit the ground running.”

Much like Doti and Struppa during their presidencies, Parlow used data-driven assessment to raise the standards for admission at Fowler Law. But he didn’t stop there. With a special focus on fundraising, he increased alumni donors by 500% and eliminated a deep budget deficit. This allowed him to attract some of the brightest incoming students and exceptional faculty that together helped the law school climb more than 20 spots in the rankings.

All the while, his passions for supporting people and his community continued to light his path. He developed the First Generation Scholars Program at the law school and connected with the surrounding community to build pathways for middle and high school students to pursue college and law school.

Chapman Trustee Parker Kennedy, who gifted a historic \$15 million to the law school, is confident that Chapman’s position for the future could not be stronger with Parlow leading the way.

“We have leadership and financial strength, an amazing faculty and staff, an unmatched location, the right balance of tradition and innovation that students seek, and programs and facilities that are second to none,” said Kennedy, who is also chairman emeritus of First American Financial Corporation. “I am genuinely excited by what lies ahead.”

When Parlow moved to the role as Chapman’s executive vice president and chief advancement officer, he scaled his fundraising and impact even higher. Most notably, he led the largest fundraising

campaign in Chapman’s history known as *Inspire: The Campaign for Chapman University*. The campaign has exceeded expectations and is only continuing to grow. He became an ambassador of Chapman’s mission to partner with more leaders within the Orange County community and expand opportunities for students, faculty, and university programs.

“To me, this is also deeply personal,” Parlow said with reverence and excitement for his role as president. “I love Chapman. It’s been a home for me in so many ways. It’s a community I feel really connected to. And it has so many people I care so much about.”

If Doti is the builder and Struppa the scholar, Parlow considers himself the connector. His predecessors at Chapman are handing him a sturdy foundation and now he gets to use his passion for people and students to reach the next chapter.

“I believe in our mission,” Parlow says. “I believe in the collective work that we do together that makes an impact on our students and the community.”

# After Nearly 20 Years of Leadership and Impact, Daniele Struppa's Legacy Continues to Shine

When Daniele C. Struppa, now president emeritus, reflects on his two decades of leadership at Chapman University—first as provost and later as president—the thing he attributes his endless striving for excellence to is his curiosity. His tenure has been nothing short of monumental with achievements in academic distinction, research growth, financial strength, and a new era of prominence among the nation's top educational institutions.

“Daniele's legacy at Chapman will be that he brought the school up several notches,” shared Jim Burra, Chair of the Chapman Board of Trustees and longtime executive and entrepreneur in Orange County. “He started off with a really good base, having followed Jim Doti, but he knew that, and he took it to the next level academically, in research, and in the administrative strength of our financial situation.”

“What Doti gave me was a perfectly running machine,” Struppa said. “I didn't have to fix anything. I could concentrate and focus on growing and strengthening what we had. And that's really a rare benefit. And I think that he's the main reason why Chapman is what it is now.”

Struppa's curiosity and passion for scholarly achievements was contagious. He cultivated such a powerful research culture among faculty and students that Chapman rose to the national stage once again as it earned its ranking as an R2 university in 2019, a status only 10% of U.S. universities hold. He increased the endowment to more than \$900 million, allowing the university to open more colleges and allocating the resources faculty needed to produce unique scholarly work.

He brought in state-of-the-art facilities such as the Keck Center of Science and Engineering, the Swenson Family Hall of Engineering, and the Sandi Simon Center for Dance to inspire students and enrich their educational pursuits. Some of Struppa's latest achievements are indicative of his commitment to next-level academic excellence in all disciplines. These include the Daniele C. Struppa Research Park at the historic Lydia D. Killefer School site, which is the home of the university's Institute for Quantum Studies, and the implementation of the Dhont Innovation Hub at Chapman Studios West, which will launch in 2026.

All of this growth is what the community began to coin as the Struppa Effect. With charisma, he encouraged people across the university to reach higher and pursue actionable goals, and he recruited prestigious faculty who were excited for the direction he was taking Chapman.

“Daniele's adventurer spirit is partly what has made him a great leader,” said Annette Walker, Chapman Trustee and the president of City of Hope Orange County. “He's willing to try things that other people might not be willing to try or willing to risk. It allows him to proceed with a lot of confidence and bring others along with him with the same kind of confidence.”



He understood that he could not achieve the greatness he hoped for in a silo. Perhaps it was Struppa's own understanding of mathematics and how everything—from art and music to science and physics—is connected by math that made him such a powerful voice in encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration.

Even after building such a long list of achievements that would satisfy most leaders, Struppa's dedication and curiosity isn't waning. After passing the torch to Parlow, Struppa is returning to the Chapman faculty to continue bolstering student curiosity and enduring passion. Parlow will carry on Struppa's and Doti's legacies for Chapman so it endures for years to come.

Chapman's unique presidential tradition—marked by focused vision, intuition, and strong leadership that builds instead of recreates—has fueled nearly four decades of historic growth. It is this legacy that now empowers Parlow to chart the path toward an even brighter future.

“Matt is a person of great integrity,” Struppa said. “The university needs somebody who has that quality. He is a brave and very solid person. He's very smart, very intelligent. He understands complex situations, and he's able to analyze complex situations from different perspectives. But maybe the most important thing is he loves Chapman. Matt has a passion for this institution.”

In the same way Doti set Struppa up for success, Struppa has facilitated a seamless transition for Parlow.

“We're really lucky to have had three phenomenal leaders here,” Burra concluded.

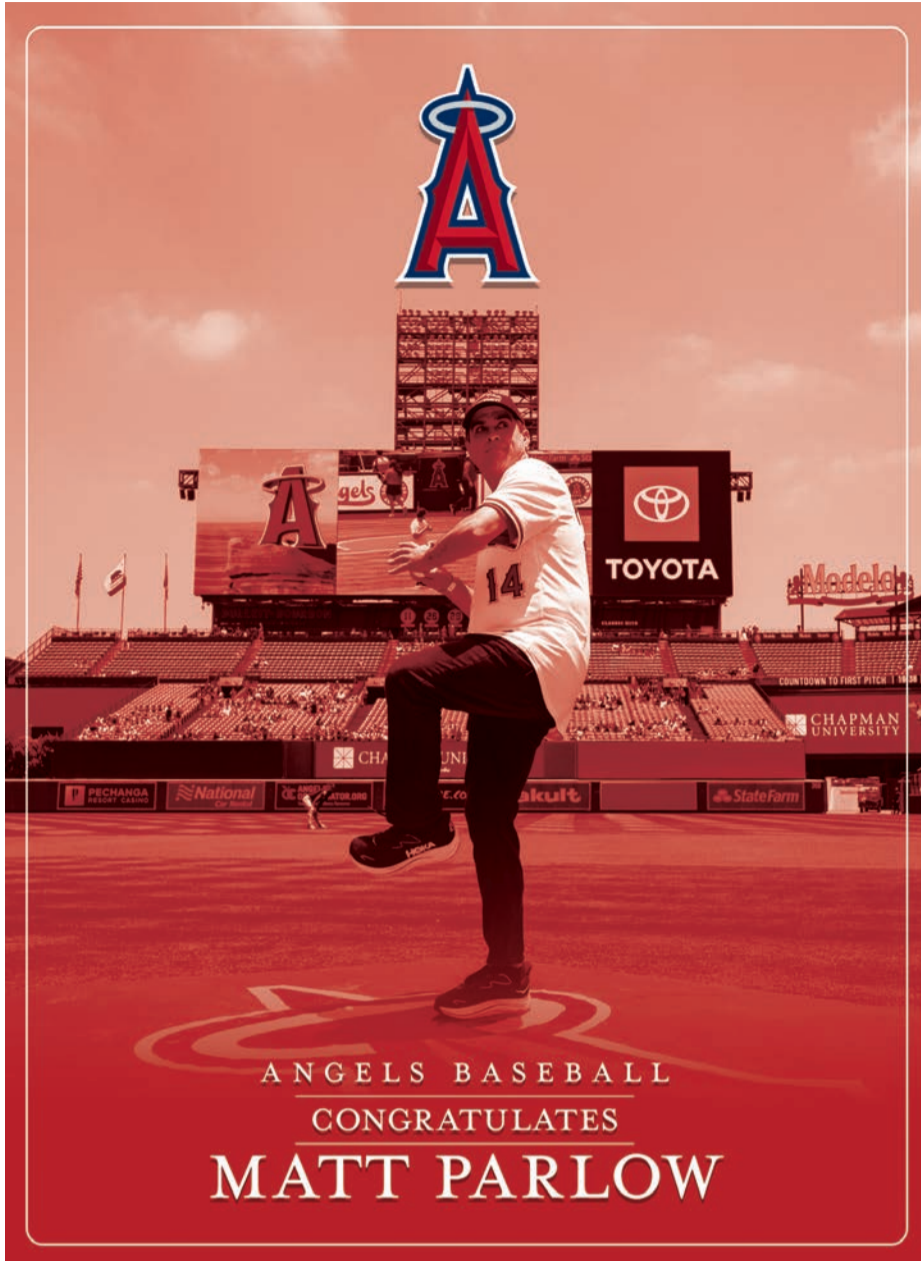
